#### WATER SUPPLY OVERVIEW

Tony Barela, Director of Operations for the San Juan Water District, provided an informative Water Supply Overview that included the history of the Folsom Reservoir, the Folsom Dam operations, and the operations of the San Juan Water District Treatment Plant. - 15. I would like to hear more about Water Rights.
- 16. I really enjoyed learning all this but am disappointed we couldn't go visit Folsom Dam.
- 17. We're incredibly blessed to have the ease of water we have and to learn more about the hard work that goes into making our water available and safe.
- 18. Very fascinating information, and I'm intrigued with the changes at the reservoir.
- 19. It might be useful to know more about water issues everywhere.
- 20. Great presentations, and I learned so much; I'm surprised that there isn't projected to be a water supply problem in our District in 40 years.
- 21. It's much clearer that the District has rights to a certain amount of water. We are fortunate to have such good water that others don't necessarily have.
